## From the Principal

## Dear Norris Road Community,

Well Day 8 is here and I can confirm that we have grown our student population to 703. This means that we were able to create 29 classes. We are very pleased to welcome Miss K to our school, taking the new Year 3 class. Miss K is well known to us at Norris Road, having done many relief days and short contracts last year. We

#### Parent Teacher Evening

These will take place on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> February (Week 4). There will be two thirty-minute sessions offered for each cohort to allow families to attend multiple sessions. With current restrictions in place, we are able to offer **one parent/carer per child per class** at each session. Presentations will occur in the classroom with numbers capped at 18 adults per classroom/36 adults per double teaching space.

#### **Assemblies**

At this stage, attendance at senior and junior assemblies is by invitation only. Whole school assemblies are conducted online across the school, with classes logging on and watching together. When restriction ease, we look forward to welcoming everyone at their liking to attend assemblies.

#### Pick up and Drop off Zones

I do appreciate the frustration being experienced at the start of this year, particularly at Pritchard Place and Greenore Street. We had moments of ease last year, but unfortunately some have reverted to old habits or are just not aware of the impact they have on those around them.

Pritchard Place has clearly signed regulations regarding parking times. Please be aware that Council parking inspectors can attend and issue fines. Thank you very much to those who relocated to the TAFE carpark and waited for the right time to move to the 2 -minute zone and keep the traffic moving.

Another impact this congestion has is for our families who use the back carpark to pick up students with disabilities, they are unable to enter or exit the back gate without clear access which can create distress for these students. Some complaints I have received have been about abusive language. I wonder...What are we modelling to our children? As adults we have a responsibility to model appropriate behaviour to our young people. Please do the right thing. My priority is to our children and their future. Despite some comments on Facebook, I do care but I cannot always be available from 2pm to 3pm, and I do not always have staff available, to 'encourage' people follow the rules. Please be aware the Glencam Street carpark is a staff carpark and not a pickup and drop off point for school or YMCA in the morning after 7am or before 4pm in the afternoon. The

pedestrian gate is available for students to enter and exit the school safely. Students should not enter the car parking area at any time.

When we all follow the rules, we help each other.

FYI, I am also investigating the Crossing Supervisor position already zoned for Pritchard Place. When I know more, I will advise.

**District Sport Trials** – Throughout the year there will be a variety of different sport trials (Eg. netball, rugby league). Students who attend these trials need to possess very good skills. School coaches will select which students attend the trials (if the sport is played at school). Students selected to attend trials need to return the required forms to school. The nomination fee needs to paid online EXCEPT for swimming, cross country, and track and field, where the fee is paid to the office. There are nomination deadlines for all trials. Students need to hand in all forms (signed and stamped by the school) at all trials.

<u>Friday Enrichment activities</u> – In week 1, students in Year 5 and 6 selected an activity to participate in during Term 1 on Fridays. Year 5 and 6 students could have selected an inter-school sport (touch football or Newcombe) or a school-based activity (games at school, art or TMC – Think. Move, Create). All of the options were explained to the students prior to selection. N.B. There will be a cost involved with travelling to outside sporting venues for inter-school sport. Inter-school sport permission letters will be distributed ASAP. In terms 2 and 3, the grade 4, 5, and 6 will be involved in Friday enrichment activities. Hats, sunscreen and water bottles are required if students are participating in outdoor activities on Fridays.
