From the Principal

Dear Norris Road Community,

Stage 2 of the Norris Road upgrades

AEDC Data collection

The Australian Early Development Census (AEDC) is a population based measure of how children have developed by the time they start school. It looks at five areas of early childhood development: physical health and wellbeing, social competence, emotional maturity, language and cognitive skills (school-based), and communication skills and general knowledge.

The last census was completed in 2018. Norris Road Prep Teachers will be involved in completing this data gathering later this year. More information will be provided to Prep families as it is provided to the school.

Voluntary Contribution

Each year the school seeks support from our families by way of the voluntary contribution. This is approved each year at the P&C AGM. It is set at \$60 per student, capped at \$120 per family. This money is used to buy additional stationery items and learning materials not added to the booklist. All students should arrive at school **no later than 8.25 am**. Supervision is provided at the hall from 8am to 8.25am. Students will be expected to sit quietly.

The end of playtime is signalled by a bell. At this time students are required to visit the toilet, wash hands and have a drink and line up quietly in designated areas. No student is to enter a classroom without a teacher being present.
