ANZAC Day March- Sandgate:

Tomorrow, Friday April 25, 2025, Norris Road State School will participate in the Sandgate ANZAC March. All students from Norris Road State School are invited to join the Sandgate community's ANZAC March. It is anticipated that our school leaders and student councillors will also attend as part of their leadership responsibilities.

To join us on the March, please take note of the following details:

- The RSL will start the March at 9:00 am sharp. The March will begin at the corner of Cliff Street and Second Avenue in Sandgate. We will begin gathering at 8:45 am on Cliff Street and Second Avenue. Look out for our school's banner.
- Students need to be in full uniform and must have a Norris Road State School hat to march. We also encourage students to apply sunscreen before arriving at the drop off point. Students are permitted to carry a water bottle if they choose. Those staff who are attending will walk with the students for the entire March.

- Our school leaders (including student councillors) should all be in attendance to represent the school.
- Mid way through the March there will be a point where they will ask students to take off their hats as a mark of respect.
- We anticipate that the March will be completed by approximately 9:30 am. Students can be collected at the western end of Keogh Street at the conclusion of the March. Staff will wait with your child until they are collected.

Smart School Parking: Keeping Kids Safe Around School Zones:

We know that getting your child to and from school safely is every parent's top priority. When it comes to parking around schools in Queensland, knowing and following the road rules plays a big part in protecting all students — not just your own.

Understanding School Parking Zones

Schools are busy places during drop-off and pick-up times. That's why parking signs and road markings around schools are strictly enforced. Here's what every parent should know:

- No Parking zones: You can stop here for up to 2 minutes to drop off or pick up your child, but you must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.
- **No Stopping zones**: These are strict no-go areas. Stopping here, even briefly, is illegal and dangerous.
- **Bus Zones**: These are for school buses only during the times stated on the sign.
- **Pedestrian Crossings**: Do **not park within 20 metres** before or **10 metres** after a crossing. It blocks sightlines and puts children in danger.

How to Use a Stop, Drop and Go Zone

These are specially designated zones where traffic can keep flowing while children get in or out safely. Here's how to use them properly:

- 1. **Pull forward** as far as possible in the zone.
- 2. Stay in your vehicle at all times this is not a parking space.
- 3. Children must exit on the kerb side never into traffic.
- 4. **Be quick** no more than 2 minutes. If your child isn't ready, drive around and rejoin the queue.

Using this zone properly helps everyone move efficiently and safely.

Double Parking: A Serious Risk

Double parking – stopping beside a parked car to let your child out – is illegal and highly dangerous. It:

- Blocks visibility for children crossing.
- Forces children to step into traffic to reach the footpath.
- Slows traffic and increases the risk of accidents.

Even if you're in a hurry, double parking puts all students at risk.

Final Tips for Safer School Pickups

- Arrive a few minutes later: Traffic usually eases 5–10 minutes after the bell.
- Park legally and walk: A short walk to the gate is safer than an unsafe drop-off.
- Teach your child to use crossings and never run across roads.

Let's work together to keep school zones safe. A few extra minutes of caution could save a life.

The Premier's Coding Challenge is an annual, statewide initiative for all Queensland students in Year 3 to Year 10. The Premier's Coding Challenge aims to encourage an interest in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) in Queensland students.

In 2025, students are tasked with creating an app, game or website that drives positive change in the world by addressing 1 or more of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals 🖉 (SDGs).

As a signatory to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, Australia reports on progress against the 17 SDGs, which serve as a roadmap for global development initiatives through 2030 and beyond.

This is a great opportunity for students to tackle real-world issues that matter to them.

To enter, students can work individually or in pairs to create an app, game, or website and submit a short video explaining their entry. Find out more about the categories on the get started page.

All participating students will receive a certificate signed by the Premier and Minister for Education. Winners will share in \$15,000 worth of robotics prizes, attend an awards ceremony and connect with tech experts to explore future pathways.

Travel and accommodation will be provided for eligible winning students, their parent/carer and a school representative to attend the awards ceremony.


