PREP

Frequently Asked Questions

When can my child start PREP? In Queensland, Prep is the first year of schooling. Children must be 5 by 30 June in the year they start Prep. Prep is a full-time program and children attend from Monday to Friday during normal school hours.

Can I visit the school?

You will be able to visit the school when your Prep interview is held (Prep Enrolment Interview booking dates will be advertised in Term 2 for dates in Term 3 for 'in catchment' and siblings of current NR students. Please use the link to book https://eq.sobs.com.au/pt3/parent.php?schoolid=70149). We will hold Prep Transition sessions in Term 4 (late October to November).

What is the procedure for enrolling my child?

Please contact the school on 3261 0777, or email admin@norrisroadss.eq.edu.au for further information. We will provide you with an enrolment pack which contains all the necessary enrolment forms required. Once completed, these forms can be returned to the Administration Building. Alternatively, you can send through completed enrolment forms to admin@norrisroadss.eq.edu.au. If you are out of catchment, there will be information for you to put your child's name down on our Prep waiting list.

What time does school operate?

School operates from 8:30-2:30. We have two lunch breaks, 10:30-11:00, and 1:00-1:40.

What are your class sizes?

Recommended class sizes for Prep to Year 3 are 25 students. Class sizes depend upon enrolments that we receive from year to year.

Do you have before and after school care?

How does the tuckshop operate?

How do I find out what is happening at school?

Our school website is our first port of call (<u>www.norrisroadss.eq.edu.au</u>), and the QSchools app can be downloaded. Norris Road SS has a newsletter – NR News for Families and a Facebook page that is updated regularly. Each term, each year level provides a class newsletter, outlining what is on in the class for the term.

Policies and Procedures on allergies and anaphylaxis?

Please inform us if your child has allergies, whether they range from mild or severe. We will document these on the student profile. If your child exhibits, or has the chance of exhibiting a mild or severe reaction, an Anaphylaxis Action Plan is developed in consultation with your child's doctor. These plans are prominently displayed across the school, as well as the location of EpiPens ® or Anapens ®. Schools are required to store anaphylaxis injectors. Your child should also have their own anaphylaxis emergency kit.

What are Pupil Free Days?

Pupil Free Days are attended by staff only. These days are put in place to allow teachers and teacher aides to participate in Professional Development and prepare for the school year. Students do not attend school on these days.

How can I get involved in my child's school?

Parents/Caregivers can become involved in the school by joining the P&C, help in the tuckshop, and helping in the classroom. To join the P&C contact them on pandc@norrisroadss.eq.edu.au and if you can help in the tuckshop please email tuckshop@norrisroadss.eq.edu.au. To help in your child's classroom, simply approach the class teacher.

Do Preps have a Booklist and if so, when will I receive this?

Yes, they do. Booklists can be found on the school website and are updated each year.

Will there be an Orientation Day for my child?

Orientation Days will be held in November. Children will join a Prep class for the morning session while parents will join an information session hosted by the Head of Curriculum and Speech Pathologist.

I am on the Out of Catchment Waiting List for Prep, when will I know if my child has been accepted and how will I be notified?

Once we have completed interviews and accepted enrolments for in catchment families, we will determine capacity and contact families on the Out of Catchment Waiting list. Contact will be made towards the end of Term 3. If you have been notified of acceptance for your child to enrol, we will arrange an interview time with you and your child.
